To work to the best advantage, there should be two men--one to keep a straight line with the compass and to pace the distances and the other to estimate and tally the trees. This method is especially desirable in case of surveyed land, where the estimate should be made by forties. In ordinary practice it is usual to cross each forty four times, tallying by the strip method already described. It is better, however, to go through each block (in the case of surveyed land a quarter section) on lines not over 100 yards apart, making a halt at every 100 yards, and estimating the 100-yard square around this station.
